

Paulina Zamarripa is a young artist from Austin, Texas and one of my closest friends. The talented Paulina goes to the School of the Art Institute of Chicago as a sophomore (almost junior) and is majoring in studio art. They are known in their community both in Austin and Chicago for their vibrant comics and illustrations presented on their art Instagram account, @paulinas_art. This account is one that

brings genuine amazement and admirability for the display of their deeply personal archive. Paulina uses her personal experiences and interests as inspiration for their work—they illustrate exactly what they are trying to convey through colorful and sometimes gory pieces. In this interview Paulina discusses topics relating to their artistic abilities ranging from how they deal with art block to their experience with art school.

We see a common theme and use of primary colors throughout your

art. What draws you to these?

I think for most of my life I've always been scared of horror movies, but specifically when childish and nostalgic elements are paired with gore—that really freaks me out. Primary colors to me represent childhood and I find it feels right to me to pair with gore.

What inspires your comics?

I like to make random shit that I think is funny, but no one else thinks is funny. I also pull a lot of inspiration from my nightmares—they're quite vivid and drawing them just feels

You go to SAIC, would you say art school has helped you reach your creative potential better or limited you?

I am grateful for school because it forces me to take a good amount of time to get things done and commit. It also allows me to examine my personality in my work and learn through perceiving other people's work, but it just feels unnecessary for the things I wanna do. Art school is a weird ass bubble that people spend way too much time and money on. everyone becomes way more pretensious than they wree before.

Are there any artists that particularly inspire you?

for comics I would say Michael Deforge, his use of color is incredible. I've also been into sculpture stuff recently like Robert Gober; his stuff is just so unsettling.

How do you handle creative block?

I have a big ass stack of graphic novels, comics, books, and ill skim to look at the pictures—I won't even fully read them sometimes, just absorb. I also love watching movies. I'm honestly bad at creative block, but sometimes ill just take the random thoughts I have throughout the day and run with it.

Do you plan on selling your work in the foreseeable future?

I've been debating with this a lot, but I've come to the conclusion that art will never be my career. If art ever became my job and main income, I would come to resent it. It will always be my side hustle. I want to try to make affordable graphic novels or mini comics and self-publish at some point. Comics work for me because they're a good blend of writing and drawing—I would never wanna write an actual novel, but a graphic novel sounds fun.

What would you say is your main goal of your art?

One thing that I find fascinating is other people and when people are fascinated with other people and so on. When you read something specific to someone and people relate to it. It's nice to see that relation and I want people to find that in my work.


For the first time in what feels like centuries, they address me directly.

Ava: Would you want to do that photoshoot?





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
